Two Statements in respect of the Expert Committee on Printing set up in March, 1949 and the Departmental Committee for Stationery and Printing Department set up in August, 1951 are laid on the Table of the House. - (b) Both these Committees collected the information, statistics and data required by them from the Presses and the Central Stationery Office. It was not necessary to associate the employees or the unions with the deliberations of the Committees.

## MANGENAPUDI SALT CENTRE

- (c) when it was handed over to the Andhra Scientific Company on contract basis:

- (e) how many acres are now under salt production and how many under crops?

The Minister of Production (Shri K. C. Reddy): (a) The Mangenapudi Salt Factory was founded in the year 1863.

- (b) The factory came under the direct control of the Central Government in 1926 and still continues to be
- (c) The factory was never handed over to the Andhra Scientific Company on any basis. About 60 acres of land in this factory have, however, been leased to Messrs. National Chemicals Ltd, for a period of 10 years which will expire on the 28th February, 1954.
- (d) The production has been on the increase during the last few years.
  - (e) 280 acres are under salt producon and none under any other crop.
