FOOD CONSUMPTION

1249. Shri C. R. Chowdary: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state the average number of calories consumed per head per day in food in India in the years 1950-51, 1951-52 and 1952-53?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri (Kidwai): A statement giving the available information for 1950-51 and 1951-52 is laid on the Table of the House. Information for 1952-53 is not yet available.

3. In arriving at figures of consumption, figures of production have been taken and allowance made for animal feed, seed, wastage, milling loss and the net imports or exports, as the case may be. The figures of production on the present system of reporting may contain a considerable error.

4. Yearly production figures in respect of certain items of food, viz., fruits, meat, eggs, fish etc. are not available. Estimates for the latest available year have been utilized in the case of these articles of foxd.

(c) The export of monkeys is not controlled under the Export Trade Control Regulations. Under the Sea Customs Act, however, control is exercised by the Ministry of Finance (Revenue Division) and export is not \checkmark allowed during five months of the year, viz., April to August, except by air for research or scientific purposes.
