Tourist Traffic

45. Shri Heda: Will the Minister of Transport be pleased to state the total estimated income by overseas tourist traffic in 1952?

The Deputy Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Alagesan): The financial advantage accruing to the Government from overseas tourist traffic is to be measured in terms of the foreign exchange which is equivalent to the amount of foreign tourist spendings in this country. This amount for the year 1952 was Rs. 2.5 crores approximately.
