The Minister of Production (Suri K. C. Reddy): (a) One Salt Research Station is being established at Bhavnagar in Saurashtra under the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research. There are, however, five Salt Department Laboratories located at the following places:—

Deodani, Sambhar Lake. Wadala, Bombay. Humma, Orissa. Tondiarpet, Madras. Tuticorin, Madras.

SYNTHETIC GEMS

- 272. Shri Rajagopala Rao: (a) Will the Minister of Commerce dustry be pleased to state the quantity and value of synthetic corundum and synthetic gem stones imported into India during the past five years, year-wise?
- (b) What are the import duties levied on (i) imported synthetic corundum, uncut and cut as gem stones separately and (ii) other synthetic gem stones, both uncut and cut as gem stones?
- (c) Are there any synthetic gem stone industries, manufacturing the above material in India?
- (d) Is any protection or special encouragement given to this industry by the Government of India?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari):
(a) and (b). Separate statistics for synthetic stones are not available from Sea Borne Trade Accounts.

(c) and (d). There is no manufacture of synthetic stones. Processing of imported synthetic gems is, however, carried on as a cottage industry in Rajasthan and Madras. As manufacture has not yet been established, the question of any protection does not, for the present arise.

HEAVY ELECTRICAL POWER PLANT INDUSTRY

273. Shri S. N. Mishra: Will the Minister of **Production** be pleased to state:

(a) the firms which are prepared to participate financially and technically in the project for Heavy Electrical Power Plant Industry; and (b) whether they have commenced a survey of the prevailing conditions?

The Minister of Production (Shri K. C. Reddy): (a) Messrs. Siemens of Germany, English Electric Company of the U.K., and Associated Electrical Industrics Limited of the U.K.

(b) Siemens sent a delegation to this country to undertake a local study of market conditions and production facilities. The delegation also held discussions with various Government departments and officials concerned, and then the team returned to Germany to prepare the project study. The report is expected shortly for consideration by the Government of India. The offers of English Electric Company and Associated Electrical Industries Limited are under examination.
