PROCUREMENT OF FOODGRAINS

330. Shri Sanganna: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

- (a) whether any instructions have been issued to the surplus State Governments to stop procurement of foodgrains on reaching certain targets; and
- (b) if so, what are the targets fixed for each State?

The Deputy Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri M. V. Krishnappa):
(a) and (b). The surplus States have been told that we were considering advising them to stop further procurement of rice after a certain target had been reached. The position is under examination and no targets have yet been fixed.

POST OFFICES IN BANARAS DISTRICT

331. Shri Ganpati Ram: Will the Minister of Communications be pleased to state the total number of new post offices opened in Banaras District in 1952 and 1953 and the estimated expenditure incurred on them?

In 1951-52, six new post offices were opened in Banaras District, in 1952-53 four, and in 1953-54 (up to the end of February) three. The approximate additional annual expenditure on these thirteen new post offices is estimated at Rs. 12,600.

- (b) which Unions have been recognised after the initiation of 'Re-alignment' talks in 1948 and how many of them are affiliated to INTUC; and
- (c) whether the membership shown above is based on the receipt of subscription or on information given by the unions?

The Deputy Minister of Communications (Shri Raj Bahadur): (a) A statement in 4 parts containing the required information is laid on the Table of the House. [See Appendix VI, annexure No. 41.]

(b) The realignment talks began in 1948 but broke down in January 1949

on account of disagreement between the Unions themselves. Unions recognised after the so called "initiation" of the realignment talks are:

- (1) All India Telephone and Telegraph (Engineering) Union;
- (2) Telecommunication Engineering Supervisors' Association.
- (3) All India Telegraph Line Staff Union.
 - (4) P. and T. Mazdoor Union.
- (5) Telegraph Traffic Officers' Association.

Out of these only the P. and T. Mazdoor Union Calcutta is known to be affiliated to the INTUC.

(c) The membership shown in part IV is based on the information supplied by the Unions.
