(क) उत्तर प्रदेश के किन जिलों में डी० डी० टी० छिड़का गया है और दूसरी मलेरिया निरोधक कार्यवाहियों की गई हैं ; और

(ख) मलेरिया निरोधक आन्दोलन कितने गांवों में चलाया गया है और वहां कितना डी० डी० टी० छिड़का गया

The Minister of Health (Rajkumari Amrit Kaur): (a) and (b). A Statement is laid on the Table of the House. [See Appendix III, annexure No. 69]

EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGES

163. Th. Lakshman Singh Charak: (a) Will the Minister of Labour be pleased to state the number of persons registered in all the Employment Exchanges of India during 1953 month-wise?

(b) How many persons were given employment through the Exchanges and under what category?

(c) How many have been absorbed in the private sector?

The Deputy Minister of Labour (Shri Abid Ali): (a) and (b). A statement is placed on the Table of the House. Information in regard to applicants registered each month at the Exchanges is not collected by trade categories. [See Appendix III, annexure No. 70]. The number of persons placed in employment has however, been shown in the statement by broad occupational groups.

PRICE OF RICE

164. Shri Barman: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

(a) the retail control price of rice of common, fine, and superfine varieties in the States of Bombay, West Bengal, Chandernagore, Delhi, Madras and Hyderabad;

(b) the average market price of rice in the above States; and

(c) whether there is any difference between rice procured internally and that purchased from overseas?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) and (b). Two Statements are placed on the Table of the House showing (i) retail prices of common, fine and superfine rice in Bombay, West Bengal, Chandernagore, Delhi, Madras and Hyderabad and (ii) the market prices of rice during November, 1953 to February, 1954. [See Appendix III, annexure No. 71]

(c) Yes, Sir. Generally speaking, the landed cost of imported rice is higher than the price of internally procured rice.

FOOD CONFERENCES

165. Shri Ramachandra Reddi: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

(a) the number of conferences held by the Central Government with the representatives of the State Governments in 1952-53 and 1953-54 in regard to matters relating to food (i) at the ministerial level, (ii) at the Secretariat level, and (iii) at the level of heads of administration;

(b) the decisions arrived at; and

(c) the decisions implemented?

The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) Two conferences were held during 1952-53 and 1953-54, one at Ministers' level on 8th and 9th January, 1953 and the other at Secretaries' level on the 10th and 11th November, 1953.
