**Th. Lakshman Singh Charak:** May I know how many ticketless travellers were convicted and what amount, if any, was realised by way of fines?

**Shri Shahnawaz Khan:** We have not got full details yet.

**Th. Lakshman Singh Charak:** May I know what were the permanent constructions as mentioned in part (b) of the question?

**Shri Shahnawaz Khan:** The Kumbh Mela is supposed to last till the 15th March. It is not over yet. When the Mela is over, we will get full details.

**Th. Lakshman Singh Charak:** The question is only regarding permanent constructions that have been put up so far. It has got nothing to do with the ending of the Kumbh Mela.

**The Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri L. B. Shastri):** The permanent constructions are: some platforms have been raised and improved, sheds have been put up in several platforms, circulating areas have been made and there are certain other constructions, which will be maintained for other Kumbh Melas in the coming years.

MALARIA

\*231. **Shri L. Jageswar Singh:** Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:

(a) the measures that the Government of India have taken so far to

fight malaria in the malaria ridden areas of Assam, Manipur and Tripura; and

(b) the progress made so far in this direction?

**The Deputy Minister of Health (Shrimati Chandrasekhar):** (a) Malaria Control units have been allotted to these States under the National Malaria Control Programme. Five standard units have been allotted to Assam and one small unit each, to the States of Manipur and Tripura.

(b) In Assam, the units are in the process of formation, in Manipur the unit has just started functioning and in Tripura it started functioning in July 1953 and has given protection to an area with a population of 1.37 lakhs.

**Shri L. Jogeswar Singh:** May I know what is the target year by which malaria in these areas can be expected to be completely removed?

**Shrimati Chandrasekhar:** These malaria units will be there in the States till 1956. Then, the work will be continued by the State Governments.

**Shri L. Jogeswar Singh:** My question is, what is the target year by which malaria can be expected to be completely removed in these areas.

**The Minister of Health (Rajkumari Amrit Kaur):** The purpose of this anti-malaria programme cannot be to eradicate it altogether. The question is of reducing it to such an extent that it can be kept under control and in the first Five Year Plan, we want to cover 125 millions of the population.

**Shri Nanadas:** May I know the total amount spent in the three States in this connection?

**Rajkumari Amrit Kaur:** I am afraid I have not the figures here.

**Shri Muniswamy:** May I know the total area in terms of the population that could be covered by these units?

**Rajkumari Amrit Kaur:** In these particular States?

**Shri Muniswamy:** Yes.

**Rajkumari Amrit Kaur:** In Assam, for example, in order to protect the whole of the population, we shall have to have nine standard units. I have not got actually the Assam figures at the moment but we have five units covering a population of 90 lakhs. In Manipur, the population at risk is six lakhs. In Tripura also, the population at risk is six lakhs.

#### WRITTEN ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

##### RAILWAY PORTERS

\*196. **Shri A. K. Gopalan:** Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

(a) the rate of wages per head-load of luggage that the porters on the Southern Railway station platforms are permitted to charge at the moment;

(b) whether any orders were recently issued by the Railway authorities reducing these charges; and

(c) the basis on which these orders were issued?

**The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Shahnawaz Khan):** (a) The rate is annas 4 at Madras Central, Madras Egmore, Trichinopoly, Bezwada, Mysore, Bangalore City, Madura, Coimbatore, Ootacamund and Coonoor, and annas 2 at all other stations.

(b) and (c). No such orders have been issued recently. But the rates were revised from 1st January 1952 after the formation of the Southern Railway with a view to standardizing them over the entire railway. The revision was effected in consultation with the then Local Advisory Committee.
