The Minister of Health (Rajkumari Amrit Kaur): (a) Yes.

(b) It is not possible to say at present when the Bill will be introduced.

MANGANESE MINES IN MADHYA PRADESH

- 450. Shri N. A. Borkar: Will the Minister of Labour be pleased to state:
- (a) the number of manganese mines operating in Madhya Pradesh;
- (b) the number of manganese mines which have been closed down; and
- (c) the number of labourers thrown out of employment due to the closure of these mines?

The Minister of Labour (Shri K. K. Desai): (a) The number of mines working at the end of 1953 was 264.

- (b) 87 in 1954.
- (c) About 16,000, according to the employment figures for 1953.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION IN MANIPUR

- 451. Shri Rishang Keishing: Will the Minister of Transport be pleased to state:
- (a) the programme of foad construction for the State of Manipur under the Five Year Plan;
- (b) the mileage of roads in Manipur so far constructed and the mileage under construction since the operation of the Five Year Plan; and
- (c) the names of roads to be constructed during the remaining period of the Plan?

The Deputy Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Alagesan): (a) and (c). A statement containing the required information is attached. [See Appendix VI, annexure No. 14].

(b) Mileage improved 108. Mileage under improvement 114. Mileage of new roads under construction 49.

SALEM-BANGALORE RAIL LINK

- 452. Shri S. V. Ramaswamy: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:
- (a) whether there is any proposal for the construction of a Railway line linking Salem and Bangalore; and
- (b) if so, at what stage the proposal is at present?

The Deputy Minister of Railways and Transport (Shri Alagesan): (a) Yes

(b) The operating advantages to be derived by the proposed Metre Gauge link are under investigation.

POST OFFICES IN INDIA

- 453. Shri Hem Raj: Will the Minister of Communications be pleased tostate:
- (a) the number of Post Offices, rural and urban in the country in 1953-54;
- (b) the number of Post Offices proposed to be opened in 1954-55 in rural and urban areas, respectively, State-wise;
- (c) the number of rural Post Offices which were doing Savings Bank business in 1953-54; and
- (d) whether there is any proposal to entrust more rural Post Offices with the Savings Bank business?

The Deputy Minister of Communications (Shri Raj Bahadur): (a) On 31st March, 1954 there were 6,179 urban and 39,728 rural Post Offices in India.

- (b) and (c). Information is being collected and a statement will be placed on the Table of the House shortly.
- (d) Savings Bank facilities are provided in rural Post Offices as and when circumstances permit.

Water Supply and Sanitation Scheme for Punjab

- 454. Shri Hem Raj: Will the Minister of Health be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Punjab Government have submitted any scheme
