N.E.F.A.

692. Pandit D. N. Tiwary: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have been able to unearth the workshops where old abandoned British and American arms and ammunitions are repaired and made fit for use by the hostile Nagas in the Tuensang Division of N.E.F.A.;
- (b) whether it is a fact that the Nagas get a good supply of arms and ammunitions of Indian make; and
- (c) if so, whether the source of supply has been found out?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) There are no Workshops as such, but a few experienced men are carrying out repairs and replenishments by indigenous methods.

(b) and (c) Most of the arms and ammunition have been in the area for some time and are World War II weapons of British and American make. A few arms are of Indian make as is some of the ammunition. They are mostly the stock brought over in the area during and at the end of World War II. Regular searches are being made in suspected villages and ammunition are being surrendered and confiscated.

Cottage Industries in Andhra

Satyagrahis in Goa

696. {Shri Tushar Chatterjea: Shri H.R. Nathani:

Will the **Prime Minister** be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Indian Satyagrahis rendered invalid as a result of serious injuries suffered during Goa Satyagraha in August, 1955; and
- (b) whether any of them are getting any relief from the Government of India?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) According to information available with Government, 19 Indian satyagrahis were killed as a result of firing by Portuguese authorities in August, 307 Indian satyagrahis were admitted into hospitals in Belgaum, Karwar and Ratnagiri for treatment of injuries received on account of firing and other brutal treatment meted out to them. Of these, 127 were admitted for treatment of serious injuries 66 of which being bullet injuries.

(b) Government have not given any direct relief. But other arran gements have been made to give relief.
