than Rs. 10 per mensem is not available. The number can only be ascertained by going through the pension circulars of about four lakhs of pen-sioners. The labour and time involved in collecting the information would not be commensurate with the possible usefulness of the results.

Written Answers

- (b) Various representations have been received from Indian Army Pensioners asking for increases in their existing rates of pension.
- (c) As indicated in reply to Starred Question No. 812 answered on the 20th March 1956, various measures have been taken to liberalise the pensionary terms of personnel who became non-effective from certain crucial dates. Temporary increase in pension from Rs. 4 to Rs. 6 p.m. has been granted on account of increased cost of living to small scale pensioners not covered by the revised orders.

The Minister in the Ministry of Home Affairs (Shri Datar): (a) The Government of India sanctioned Rs. 28.00 lakhs for the year 1954-55 and Rs. 34.30 lakhs for 1955-56 to the Government of Madhya Pradesh for the welfare of Scheduled tribes. It is not known how much was actually spent by the State Government on the welfare of Scheduled tribes of Bastar. The information is being collected from the State Government and will be laid on the table of the House when received.

(b) The development schemes for the welfare of Scheduled tribes proposed to be undertaken by the Government of Madhya Pradesh during 1956-57, have not yet been received.
