Written Answers

The Minister without Portfolio (Shri V. K. Krishna Menon): (a) The answer is in the negative.

(b) The All India Council of Post-Graduate Medical Education was constituted on the 26th September, 1949, for prescribing standards of post-graduate Medical Education for the guidance of Universities, and for advising Universities with a view to securing uniformity of standards for post-graduate Medical Education throughout the Country.

The Council reviewed the position of post-graduate medical education obtaining in the different Universities in the Country from time to time, and appointed expert committees to frame regulations and syllabuses for some of the post-graduate courses. The reports of such committees for the postgraduate course in Public Health (D.P.H.) and for post-graduate training in anaesthesia were considered by the Council and the draft regulations accepted by the Council were circulated to the different Universities. The Council also examined the regulations and syllabus for a post-graduate course in radiology and a plan of studies for Diploma in Psychological Medicine to be conducted at the Institute of Mental Health in Bangalore. These courses have been recommended by the Council for adoption.

The Council appointed Visiting Committees to visit institutions and submit reports in respect of up-grading of departments in Medical Colleges and Hospitals or institutions of post-graduate diplomas in certain Universities. The names of the institutions inspected by Visiting Committees are given below:—

- Aligarh University—for institution of a post-graduate diploma in Ophthalmology.
- Prince of Wales Medical College, Patna—for upgrading the Department of Physiology.

- Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam—for upgrading the Department of Pathology.
- Mary Calvert Holdsworth Memorial Hospital—for recognition as a Centre for training of House Surgeons.
