

The Minister of Commerce and Industry and Iron and Steel (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The Committee has recommended that Govt. should recruit skilled technicians from the following sources:

(1) Training Centres run by the Ministry of Labour and State Governments.

(2) The existing Steel Plants ;

(3) The Open Market.

The Committee has also submitted a detailed list of suitable engineering works in country with information as to how many trainees can be placed in each for practical training; it has also recommended that special metallurgical courses be arranged for the trainees in :

(1) Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore.

(2) Poona Engineering College ;

(3) College of Mining and Metallurgy, Banaras.

(4) Bengal Engineering College.

(5) Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur.

FAIR PRICES OF AUTOMOBILES

GIFTS FROM U.S.S.R.

Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state the nature of gifts which India has received from U.S.S.R. after the visit of Marshal Bulganin and Mr. Khrushchev?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): Agricultural Machinery of various kinds for use in the establishment of a State Experimental Farm, and a passenger aircraft "IL-14-P" were received as gifts from the Soviet Leaders after their visit to India.

ALL INDIA HANDICRAFTS BOARD

1502. Shri Krishnacharya Joshi : Will the Minister of Production be pleased to state :

(a) what were the main activities of the All India Handicrafts Board during 1955 ;

(b) the progress made in the Pottery, Toy-Making, Mat-Weaving and Prints industries during the same period ; and

(c) whether there was a satisfactory marketing of handicraft products?

The Minister of Production (Shri K. C. Reddy) : (a) The main activities of the All-India Handicrafts Board during 1955-56 were the following :—

(1) Scrutiny of schemes of development of Handicraft Industries prepared by State Governments and institutions and recommendation of suitable financial assistance for such schemes.

(2) Establishment of Pilot Centres for the revival of selected Handicrafts Industries and training of personnel.

(3) Establishment of Design Centres and a Handicrafts Museum.

(4) Promotion of marketing of Handicrafts by organisation and participation in Exhibitions in India and abroad, publicity schemes, assistance to Emporia etc.

(5) Research into the problems of Handicrafts Industries.

(b) The Development of handicrafts is the responsibility of State Governments. However, to supplement their efforts in the development of all these industries financial assistance has been given to many State Governments on the basis of specific schemes received from them. It is understood that satisfactory progress is being made. Handicrafts Board have also started the following Pilot centres for imparting training :—

(1) Blue pottery industry at New Delhi.

(2) Dolls and toy making at Bombay.

(3) Toy-making, at Kondapalli (Andhra).

For further information the attention of the Hon'ble member is invited to the Annual Report of the Handicrafts Board for 1955-56.

(c) There has been a progressive improvement.
