(b) if so, the nature and extent of the assistance?

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Production (Shri R. G. Dubey): (a) and (b). A scheme received from the Punjab Government for imparting training in *Phulkari* work is under consideration.

NEPA NEWSPRINT FACTORY

*937. Shri H. G. Vaishnav: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether any annual subsidy is given by the Centre to the Nepa Newsprint factory (Madhya Pradesh);

(b) whether the factory has started producing its rated capacity of newsprint; and

(c) the total production of the newsprint in this factory during 1955?

The Minister of Industries (Shri Kanungo): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Not yet.

(c) 2,606 tons on a trial production basis.

COMMUNITY RADIO SETS

*939. Dr. Satyawadi : Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state the progress made, so far in the scheme of distributing Community Radio sets in the rural areas?

The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): 1,220 sets were supplied to State Governments during 1954-55. For the year 1955-56 orders have been placed for 14,169 sets and deliveries are in progress. During 1956-57 it is proposed to order and supply 12,000 sets.

EXPORT PROMOTION COUNCILS

Sardar Iqbal Singh : *945- Shri R. K. Gupta : Shri M. Islamuddin :

Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state : (a) whether any of the Export Promotion Councils have opened offices in foreign markets; and

(b) if so, which Councils and in which countries?

The Deputy Minister of Planning (Shri S. N. Mishra): The survey of Calcutta is still in progress. An interim report covering a part of the survey has been received in the Planning Commission. The salient features or conclusions of this survey as well as of other surveys will be availble in the reports when published.

SEWING MACHINES

527. Pandit D. N. Tiwary : Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that the production of sewing machines in the country has exceeded the demand;

(b) whether sewing machines are being exported; and

(c) if so, the names of the countries to which these are exported ?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry and Iron and Steel (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): (a) The Tariff Commission had estimated in 1954 that the production of domestic Sewing Machines has exceeded the demand. In recent years, both the demand and production are increasing and a precise indication of the one outrunning the other is not available. (b) Yes, Sir.

528. Shri S. C. Samanta : Will the Minister of **Planning** be pleased to state :

(a) whether according to the suggestions of the action committee for the development of small scale industries. different State Governments have undertaken a survey of their areas with a view to select the particular projects where development programmes can be started;

(b) if so, names of projects already received; and

(c) the functions of the action committee after the projects are selected?

The Deputy Minister of Planning (Shri S. N. Mishra): (a) The State Governments concerned have undertaken the surveys but they have not been completed as yet.
