## Setting up of another Atomic Plant in the Country

431. SHRI LAKSHMAN MALLICK: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal under Government's counsideration to set up another atomic plant in the country; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRI-MATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) and. (b) Yes, Sir. A proposal to set up another atomic power station in the Western Region is under consideration.

Raising of Additional Battalions of Armed Police and Border Security Force or Home Guard's in Meghalaya

432. SHRI P. A. SANGMA: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government of Meghalaya has submitted a proposal for raising an additional battalion of armed police in the State and alsotwo battalions of Border Security Force or Home Guards; and

(b) if so, Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) The State Government have sent proposals seeking Central financial assistance for raising an additional State Armed Police Battalion and two battalions of Border Wing of Home Guards.

(b) The matter is under examination.

# P.M.'s visit to Assam

433. SHRI AMAR ROYPRADHAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Prime Minister had recently visited Assam in connection with the foreign nationals issue; and

### (b) if so, the outcome of the visit?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Prime Minister visited Assam on 12th April, 1980. Several organisations groups and individuals called on the PM and explained their respective view points. Prime Minister advised the agitators to call off the agitation so that a solution satisfactory to all concerned can be found and implemented. The agitation, however, has been continuing.

## Deportation of Foreign Nationals from Assam

434. SHRI AMAR ROYPRADHAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that foreign nationals have been deported from Assam to other States; if so, their number; and

(b) the number of foreign nationals who were found in Assam State and what further steps Government have taken in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) and (b) The process of detection of foreign nationals is a continuing one. From 1952 to August 1979, a total number of 371861 infiltrators have been detected in Assam out of which 310870 have been deported.

#### Shortage of Cement

435. SHRI AMAR ROYPRADHAN: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there has been an acute shortage of cement in the country since January, 1980;

(b) if so, the reasons therefor;

(c) what is the quarterly quota of scement released to all States and Union territories since January 1989; and

(d) what is the production of cement in the country during the same period i.e. January 1980?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA): (a) and (b) The cement shortage has been persisting in the country for the past few years. In spite of efforts made to ease availability of cement through better capacity utilisation and imports, it has not yet been possible to meet the demand in full.

(c) The basic quarterly allocation fixed and allocated to the States for the first two quarters of the year (January—June, 1980) was 7.5 million tonnes.

(d) During the first five months of the current year, that is till the end of May, 1980, the cement production is of the order of 69.81 lakhs tonnes.

(a) the number of cases sent by the Central Bureau of Investigation for trial against public servants (indicating the number of gazetted officers involved), the number of convictions' secured and the number of acquittals against the cases sent for trial during each quarter of 1979 and 1980; and

(b) what deterrent measures are being taken to eradicate corruption among the public servants?
