Report Fishing Harbour at Paradeep Orissa

4142. SHRI BRAJIMOHAN MOHANTY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Programme Evaluation Organisation of Planning Commission and Evaluation Team have submitted their report regarding location of a fishing harbour at Paradeep in Orissa;

(b) whether Government is impressed with the urgency of immediate location of fishing harbour in view of growing marine fishing gathering momentum there; and

(c) steps taken to clear the project?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (SHRI BIRENDRA SINGH RAO): (a) No, Sir.

(c) The required field studies on five completed fishing harbours have been

conducted by the Programme Evaluation Organisation of the Planning Commission and their Report is expected in July, 1980. On receipt of their Report further steps will be taken to process the proposal including the proposal on Paradeep Harbour.

Demand of Milk Powder in Metropolitan cities

4143. SHRI AMAR ROYPRADHAN: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state the demand of milk powder in the metropolitan cities in the country and the quantity supplied to these cities during the last 5 months. month-wise?

THE MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (SHRI BIRENDRA SINGH RAO): The metropolitan dairies of Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi and Madras place their demands for skin milk powder from the pooled buffer stock maintained by the Indian Dairy Corporation from time to time and these demand are met by the Indian Dairy Corporation. The figures of skim milk powder supplied to the dairies in the metropolitan cities in the five months from January to May, 1980 (month-wise figures not readily available) are as follows:—

1. Calcutta	.	2,186 tonnes.
2. Delhi	.	2,184 tonnes.
3. Madras	.	1,237 tonnes.
4. Bombay	.	9 tonnes.

Rise in Price of Foodgrains

4144. SHRI AMAR ROYPRADHAN: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state the steps so far taken to check further price rise in foodgrains in the country?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (SHRI BIRENDRA SINGH RAO): Some seasonal rise in the prices of foodgrains during the lean season is a normal feature every year. With the widespread drought conditions prevailing in most parts of the country during 1979-80 the production of both
