6273. SHRI CHHITUBHAI GAMIT: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) how many four wheeler wagons were procured by Railways from various plants during the last three years year-wise;
- (b) how much the Railways fell short of target, year-wise;

- (c) what is the target for 1980-81 and how many are expected to be procured; and
- (d) what steps are being taken to meet the shortfall?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) and (b). The targets for procurement of wagons from the Industry and Railway Workshops, the actual production achieved and the shortfall in production with reference to the targets are indicated in the Table below:—

- (c) The target for procurement of wagons for 1980-81 from the Industry and Railway Workshops has been fixed at 13,000 wagons in terms of four wheelers. Although there has been slippage in production in the first 3 months, it is expected that this will be made good in the coming months and the target will be achieved.
- (d) Some of the wagon builders are installing captive diesel generating power plants with a view to improve wagon production levels. Also Ministry of Railways have now placed wagon orders on an additional manufacturing unit (M/s Jessop who had diversified to other lines of production) so that wagon production can be maximised.
