THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI KHURSHEED ALAM KHAN): (a) No, Sir.

Allotment of Steel to Orissa for Power Projects

4664. SHRI CHINTAMANI JENA: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

(a) what are the details regarding the quantity of steel allotted to Orissa for its various power projects during last three years, year-wise;

(b) whether it is a fact that difficulties are experienced in the procurement of steel of different grades viz. rounds torsteel and flats required for various power projects in the State; and

(c) if so, what action Government proposed to take to meet the shortage of these items?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE MINES (SHRI AND STEEL AND (a) Steel PRANAB MUKHERJEE): produced by the main steel plants is at present being distributed in accordance with the Guidelines for distribution of Iron and Steel materials issued by the Joint Plant Committee. This does not provide for any State-wise allocations. Allocations are made for the Power Sector as a whole and the sub-distribution is done by the Central Electricity Authority. The Joint Plant Committee is monitoring supplies to Power Sector from October 1979 onwards. Details of allocation to Power Sector during October '79-March '80 and 1980-81 are as follows:---

(b) and (c). In the case of Rounds, torsteel and flats, the production from the main steel plants forms only a small portion of the total, the balance coming from mini-steel plants and re-rollers, whose production is outside the regulation of the Joint Plant Committee. It is open to the State Electricity Boards and other consumers to procure their requirements from these sources also, in addition to whatever they get from the main steel plants. Imports of billets, rounds etc. are also made as and when necessary.
