

उदाहरण के लिये, जनवरी, 1980 के प्रारंभ में दिल्ली में वनस्पति का खुदरा मूल्य 11.40 रु० प्रति कि० ग्रा० था ; और नवम्बर, 1980 के अंत में यह 11.60 रु० प्रति कि० ग्रा० था ।

(ख) वनस्पति के मूल्यों में वृद्धि को रोकने के लिये सरकार द्वारा निम्नलिखित उपाय किये जा रहे हैं :-

1. वनस्पति उद्योगों को उसकी कच्चे तेलों की आवश्यकता के 95% तक के लिये आयातित तेलों की आपूर्ति करना ;

2. आयातित तेल, कोयले तथा टिन प्लेटों की नियमित आपूर्ति की व्यवस्था करके वनस्पति के उत्पादन की गति को बढ़ाना ;

3. सार्वजनिक वितरण प्रणाली के माध्यम से सस्ते तेल अधिक मात्रा में बेचना, इनमें आर० बी० डी० ताड़ का तेल, जो कि वनस्पति जैसा ही है, भी शामिल है ;

4. वनस्पति उद्योग के साथ निरंतर बातचीत जारी रखना, ताकि उत्पादन को बढ़ाया और मूल्य स्तर को बनाया रखा जा सके ;

5. जमाखोरों, कालाबाजारियों और असामाजिक तत्वों के खिलाफ आवश्यक वस्तु अधिनियम के उपबंधों को लागू करना ।

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) total number of employees category-wise and post-wise in Reserve Bank of India, New Delhi;

(b) the number of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes employees amongst them in each category of posts separately;

(c) whether it is a fact that Government of India notifications and rules and directives regarding reservation in recruitments and promotions for employees belonging to S/C and S/T communities are not being adopted and implemented in Reserve Bank of India, New Delhi but instead they have framed their own rules contrary to Government of India rules and detriment to the interests of S/C and S/T employees;

(d) whether some representations against these rules have been made to the management of the Bank; and

(e) if so, the corrective and remedial measures taken or proposed to be taken by the Government?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI MAGANBHAI BAROT): (a) and (b). The Reserve Bank of India has furnished the following figures as regards the total number of employees category-wise in its New Delhi office, as on 30-9-80. The Member of employees belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe communities are shown separately:

The post-wise break-up of these figures is being collected and will be laid on the table of the House.

(c) The bank has reported that the Government instructions in regard to reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in recruitment for promotion are implemented in all its offices. The promotion policy in bank is based generally on agreements/understandings arrived at with representative bodies of employees.

(d) Yes, Sir.

(e) The bank has reported that some employees belonging to general category who were superseded by their junior Scheduled Caste/Tribe employees under the bank's scheme of reservation in promotion have challenged this scheme of reservation in different high courts of the country. The bank would review its scheme as soon as these cases are disposed of.

(d) the names of tourist complexes?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) The selection of places for tourism development in the Central Sector depends upon the availability of resources and inter-se priorities; actual or potential attractions of a place for international tourists, its accessibility and availability of basic tourism infrastructure;
