(iii) 10 per cent on the basis of tax effort;

- (iv) 10 per cent for special problems of States.

## Reappointment of Probationary Inspectors in GIC

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI MAGANBHAI BAROT). (a) to (d): In the General Insurance Industry, an Inspector is appointed on probation for a period of 12 months. During this period he is expected to develop business and procure premium income for the company according to certain norms. In suitable cases, his probation period can be extended to give him further time to come up to the standard laid down. In case, however, the probationary Inspector unable to come upto the mark, services are dispensed with question of re-appointment after termination does not arise.

Those Inspectors who fulfil the business norms and pass the requisite departmental examination are absorbed on a regular basis by the Company.

## Discovery of Minerals in Kalahandi, Orissa

6245. SHRI RASA BEHARI BEHERA: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that mineralised zone containing minerals like lead, Zinc, Copper, Managanese, Bauxite and valuable stones have been found in Kalahandi District of Orissa:
  - (b) if so the details thereof; and
- (c) whether an estimate of mineral wealth has been made and if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE, STEEL AND MINES (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) to (c): About 67 million tonnes of bauxite with aver-

age 42.35 per cent Alumina and 4.55 per cent Silica and 139 million tonnes of baukite with 42 to 47 per cent Alumina and 2.3 to 2.7 per cent Silica have been estimated from the Kalrapat Plateau in Kalahandi District and the Lanjigarh and Silimali areas in the bordering region of Koraput and Kalahandi districts respectively. No Copper or zinc prospect has far been noted. Onlv specks Galena (Lead ore) have been noted in old pits near Baminimunda. mineralisation Manganese of Kutinga-Nishikhal belt of Koraput district extends North-Eastwards to the South-Eastern border of Kalahandi district. Besides, occurrences of Graphite have been recorded near Dengsurgi, Komna, Bilianjore, Baghmunda, Babupali, Gandamerang and Suklimuri localities in the Kalahandi Incidences of rare crystals district.
