Allotment of Bookstalls on Railways

7009. SHRI BHEEKHABHAI: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to refer to the reply given to Unstarred Question No. 2397 on the 5th March, 1981 regarding Railway bookstalls and states:

(a) the unemployed Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe persons who are not considered equal to unemployed graduates and monopoly holders in allotment of bookstalls on Railways;

(b) whether it is a fact that in the name of Cooperative Societies, Association, partnership and Groups, the interests of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are ignored;

(c) whether it is a fact that the monopoly groups still enjoy the benefits of holding bookstalls in Railways; and

(d) if so, reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) All future allotments of bookstalls at stations and on trains are now exclusively reserved for Cooperative Societies of Actual Workers/Vendors of the existing Contractors, Cooperative Societies of unemployed graduates, partnerships/Associations of unemployed graduates and individual unemployed graduates.

Unemployed Graduates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and their Cooperative Societies etc. are also eligible for these contracts.

(b) Only a few partnerships and Associations of unemployed graduates are operating bookstall contracts. No Cooperative Society has yet come forward for allotment of a book-stall contract. There is, therefore, no case of ignoring the interests of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

(c) and (d) No monopoly rights exist on the Railway's for any book-stall contractor.

7010. श्री कृष्ण दत्त सुल्तानपुरी : क्या स्वास्थ्य और परिवार कल्याण मंत्री यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि :

Upgradation of Districts and Taluk Hospitals

(b) whether Government propose to take modern health science as close to the rural areas as possible through upgrading the district and taluk hospitals so as to reduce the pressure on research-oriented hospitals; and

(b) and (c) During the Sixth Five Year Plan it is envisaged that facilities for specialised treatment would be provided at the Community Health Centres of the Block/Sub-Divisional/Taluka level and a system of referral of cases from these Centres to the District Hospitals/Medical College Hospitals will be introduced. It has been envisaged that Block/Sub-division/Taluk hospitals will be upgraded with four specialities and designated as Community Health Centres, serving a population of 1,00,000.
