Again, in the evening of 16th February, 1981, 120 buses were made available to the All India Congress Committee and Andhra Pradesh Congress Committee. Since 14th & 15th were holidays, the February, 1981 buses could be hired out without ` causing inconvenience to the public. Similarly, on the 16th February, 1981, the buses were made available after the peak hours. The buses were hired out on special hire charges @ Rs. 3.50 per Km. with detention charges @ Rs 20 per hour per bus and night charges per bus from 11.00 P.M. to 6,00 A.M. @ Rs. 15: The minimum charges per bus per booking are Rs. 80 as per rules of the Corporation.
