

**Ad-hoc Typist Panel**

9332. SHRI KAMLA MISHRA MADHUKAR: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether an ad-hoc typist panel, 1980 has been prepared of about 50 names from amongst those who appeared in typing test and interviewed for appointment in Railway Department;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) when orders will be issued to operate this panel for appointment?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) and (b) A panel for 51 English Typists and 17 Hindi Typists for appointment on ad hoc basis was declared on 5-8-1980.

(c) The typists were to be appointed on ad hoc basis in view of time lag in finalisation of recruitment by Railway Service Commission. This panel was not operated as candidates selected by the Railway Service Commission became available meantime.

**Surplus Engineering Supervisors**

9333. SHRI DAYA RAM SHAKYA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether his Ministry in their letter No. E(NG) 65REI/8 dated 15th April, 1966 issued directions for weightage of service to Engineering supervisors rendered surplus on the North Frontier Railway and absorbed on North Eastern Railway;

(b) if so, why the North Eastern Railway is not observing the above instructions and is discriminating against Engineering Supervisors absorbed before the 15th April, 1966; and

(c) what action Government propose to take in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) No.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) Staff rendered surplus and absorbed in alternative posts are not given weightage of past service for fixation of seniority.

**Kharagpur Railway Colony**

9334. SHRI NARAYAN CHOUBEY: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received representations regarding fast deterioration of roads, buildings, drains, etc. in the Railway colony at Kharagpur on the South-Eastern Railway;

(b) whether the Railway Administration of the South Eastern Railway sought for special allotment of funds for repairs of Kharagpur Railway colony; and

(c) if so, the steps which Government propose to take in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) Yes.

(b) and (c). The Railway has sought not a special allotment for Kharagpur, but an increased allotment of funds for maintenance of residential and service buildings over the whole Railway. This is under examination. The Railway also proposes to take up the following work in the year 1981-82:

(i) Construction of 50 units of quarters in replacement of an equivalent number of quarters which are over 50 years old.

(ii) Provision of amenities to 185 units of substandard quarters.
