

(iv) RPF staff are detailed at vulnerable outer signals, engineering restrictions and upgradients where the trains slow down.

(v) At way side stations when loads are stabled, they are guarded by RPF staff.

(vi) Intelligence about movement and activities of criminals and receivers of stolen property is collected by Crime Intelligence Branch of the RPF and raid are conducted to apprehend criminals and receivers to recover stolen property.

(vii) Close coordination is maintained by RPF with the Government Railway Police and Civil Police for effectively tackling the problem of thefts and pilferages.

Superfast Train between Udaipur and Delhi

9353. SHRI BHEEKHABHAI: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Bikaner Jodhpur are connected with Delhi by mail trains;

(b) whether Government have ever considered of joining Udaipur city by any mail train like Mewar Mail; and

(c) whether Government propose to consider alternative proposals by calling a meeting of members of Parliament of that region?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) Yes.

(b) and (c) Udaipur is already connected with Delhi by 15/16 Chetak Express. Apart from the question of traffic justification introduction of an additional train between Delhi and Udaipur has not been found operationally feasible due to line capacity constraint on sections enroute as well as inadequate terminal facilities in Delhi area.

Difficulties Faced by Kidney Transplant Patients in getting Employment

9354. SHRIMATI USHA PRAKASH CHOUDHARI: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Kidney recipients who have undergone the transplantation operation are facing difficulties in respect of employment and insurance; and

(b) if so, the measures taken to remove the difficulties of such persons?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI NIHAR RANJAN LASKAR): (a) No such report has been brought to the notice of this Ministry.

(b) Does not arise.

Local Trains not run in West Bengal on 3rd April, 1981

9355. SHRI SUDHIR GIRI: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state the reasons for not running the local trains in the South Eastern and Eastern Railway sections in West Bengal on 3rd April, 1981?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): Despite all efforts by the Railways to maintain normal suburban train services in Calcutta area on 3rd April, 1981, i.e. the day of the West Bengal Bandh, train services had to be cancelled/terminated short of destination due to interference with train running.

Allowance being Paid to Doctors for having DHE Diploma

9356. SHRI K. P. SINGH DEO: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Indian Medical Association has in-

cluded Diploma in Health Education in the Eight Schedule of the Indian Medical Association constitution;

(b) whether this will entitle the doctors with the said diploma for allowance of Rs. 50/- as is now possible for other diploma courses;

(c) how many doctors in Government hospitals in Delhi are presenting getting the allowance for their DHE diploma;

(d) whether Government are aware that there are many para medical staff in Delhi's government hospital who are having the DHE diploma but are not being given the allowance; and

(e) if so, whether Government would remove the anomaly and give the same allowance to the paramedical staff also and if so, by what time?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI NIHAR RANJAN LASKAR): (a) to (e). The Indian Medical Association has no jurisdiction in such matter. Perhaps the intended reference is to the Medical Council of India which has recognised DHE (Diploma in Health Education) granted by the Delhi University and Madurai University for the purpose of its inclusion in the First Schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, when granted to persons holding recognised medical qualification included in the Schedules to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. General Duty Officers Grade I (Grade II possessing diploma qualifications which are recognised by the Medical Council of India are entitled to grant of post graduate allowance at the rate of Rs. 50/- p.m. Information is not readily available regarding the number of doctors working in Government hospitals in Delhi who are presently receiving post-graduate diploma allowance for possessing DHE Diploma qualifications. Though there may be cases of para-medical staff in Government hospitals who possess DHE qualifications, there is no pro-

vision for grant of post-graduate allowance to them.

Level Crossing at Raynagar

9357. SHRI MUKUNDA MANDAL: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is a level crossing at Raynagar at the Eastern side of the Diamond Harbour Railway Station;

(b) whether this gate remains closed all the time;

(c) if so, the reasons thereof; and

(d) the measures which have been taken or proposed to be taken by Government to open and close the level crossing at Raynagar and to man the level crossing?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) Yes.

(b) No.

(c) Does not arise.

(d) The level crossing is situated within station limit and the gates of the level crossing are opened by the Station staff on duty as and when the road traffic offers. The present volume of traffic does not justify posting of regular gateman for operating the gates.
