Under-utilisation of /Calcutta and Madra International Airports

1883. SHRI KRISHNA CHANDRA HALDAR: Will the Minister of TOU-RISM AND CIVIL AVIATION pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that the policy of keeping the Calcutta and Madras international airports underutilised has created a serious imbalance in the distribution of flights: and

(b) if so steps take by Government to remove the imbalance in the distribution of flights, in details?

MINISTER OF TOURISM THE AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) It is the policy of the Government to encourage foreign carriers to operate scheduled services through Calcutta and Madras Airports as per the entitlement available to them under the various bilateral air agreements. Calcutta and services Madras Airport are in a position to receive a larger number of services than is the case now.

The final choice of airports to be touched by foreign airlines rests with them.

(b) The Airports at Calcutta and Madras are fully equipped versatile and sophisticated equipment to handle any type of aircraft including wide bodied aircraft.

While negotiating bilateral air services agreements, foreign airlines are offered Calcutta and Madras as points of call in India.
