Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state what efforts have been made to effect economy in expenditure on India House, London, during 1957?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): On June 6, 1957, the Prime Minister addressed all Heads of Missions regarding the imperative need for reducing expenditure with a view to conserve foreign exchange. This has been followed by a circular letter from the Ministry of External Affairs giving details of possible measures

which can be adopted by Missions abroad to effect economy of expenditure. A special committee has alsobeen formed at headquarters to consider measures for rationalisation of work both at headquarters and in Missions abroad. We are at present awaiting detailed proposals from our High Commission in London regarding reduction of staff and other economy measures which it is possible for them to enforce.
