Passenger Shed at Tarsarai Railway Station

1004. Shri Shree Narayan Das: Will the Minister of Railways be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there is no passenger shed at the Tarsarai Railway Station on the Darbhanga-Jainagar Branch of North-Eastern Railway besides the small passage to go out of the station;

(b) if so, whether there is any proposal to build one at an early date, and

(c) whether the question of electrifying this station is being considered as the power supply may be easily available from Sakri Power Station of the Bihar Government?

The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawaz Khan): (a) and (b) The concourse measuring $25' \times 12'$ near the booking window, at Tarsarai station, is utilised as waiting hall for III class passengers and at present there is no proposal to build a separate shed. Separate passengers sheds are being provided in order of priority and Tarsarai will be considered in its turn. One upper class waiting room for gents and another for ladies already exist at this station.

(c) The question of electrifying the station'will be considered when power becomes available at Tarsarai from local suppliers. It will be too costly for the railway to run lines over a distance of four miles and tap electricity from Sakri
