Opening of New Post and Telegraph Offices

1924. Shri Onkar Lal: Will the Minister of Transport and Communications be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government had any plan for 1957 to open new Post and Telegraph offices in the tribal areas of Rajasthan;

(b) if so, the details about the new Post and Telegraph offices opened and the estimated expenditure on the above buildings; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor?

The Minister of Transport and Communications (Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri): (a) Yes, as detailed in the statement laid on the Table of the Lok Sabha [See Appendix IV, annexure No. 102]

(b) and (c). The details of the Post and Telegraph offices opened so far during 1957 are given in the statement laid on the Table of the Sabha. No expenditure has been incurred on the buildings for these offices, as the Telegraph office opened is located in the same building as the post office at the station and the post offices opened are all extra departmental branch offices for which accommodation has to be arranged by the extra departmental branch postmasters themselves.
