(ii) Expansion of existing dairy plants to enhance their handling capacity.

(iii) Improvements to existing dairy farms.

(iv) Establishment of farms for keeping milch animals when they go dry and until they refreshen.

(v) Establishment of cattle colony to resettle milch animals to be dislodged from the city stables.

(e) Yes.

Tube-Wells in Punjab

411. { Shri D. C. Sharma: Sardar Iqbal Singh:

Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to state:

(a) the number of experimental tube-wells allotted to the State of Punjab so far; and

(b) how many experiments have been conducted up to date and with what result?

(b) Eight exploratory bores had been drilled in the Gurgaon and districts of Punjab upto Rohtak 31.10.1957. All the eight bores had to be abandoned as they were found dry.
