Leakage of light water was detected recently in Unit I of the Rajasthan Atomic Power Station. The leak has been pinpointed and would be plugged before restarting the unit.

Setting up of Industries in Jhalawar, Rajasthan

689. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR GO-
YAL: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) the measures taken for setting up industries in Jhalawar, a backward district in Rajasthan; and

(b) the number of industries set up in this district during the last two years and the names of the industries in which production has started?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY AND LABOUR (SHRI NARAIN DATT TIWARI): (a) and (b). An outlay of Rs. 45.09 crores has been provided in the Sixth Five Year Plan for Large and Medium Industries Sector in the State of Rajasthan.

The Central investments are primarily in large industrial projects of a basic character and the location of such projects is decided, subject to techno-economic consideration, comparatively backward regions being given preference.

Jhalawar District has been identified as industrially backward and investors are entitled to Central incentives such as, concessional finance, tax concession, hire purchase of machinery by small scale industries, consultancy for technical services, interest subsidy, special facilities for import of raw materials, rural industries projects programme, Rural Artisans Programme, Seed/Margin Money Assistance and District Industries Centre.

According to the State Government, under the DIC Programme in the Jhalawar district during 1979-80 and 1980-81, 50 and 494 new industries were set up, 1050 and 1485 candidate industries were identified, 380 and 45 projects profiles were prepared, 875 and 1473 registrations were done, 28.50 and 22.50 lakhs credit by banks and financial institutions, 869 and 1548 persons got employment respectively.
