(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI KHURSHEED ALAM KHAN): (a) Thirty nine foreign countries are participating in India International Trade Fair (November-December, 1981). Delegations from twenty four foreign countries are expected to visit the Fair (delegations from 12 countries have already visited the Fair);

- (b) While the U.K. and U.S.A are not participating at governmental level these countries are participating at private sector level. France is participating at governmental level;

(c) and (d) Most of the countries have not indicated the reasons for their non-participation.

Residential accommodation to Defence Account_s Department employees

(b) to (d). There are problems for providing residential accommodation. Action has since been taken to remedy the situation and construction is in $progres_s$ at a few stations. Proposals for other places are under consideration.

Production of coking coal in Chasnala mines of HSCO

(b) same for the Jitpur mines of the IISCO;

(c) cost of production of coal in Chasnala and Jitpur mines;

(d) amount of coal in Chasnala Jitpur transported by the ropeways, train and back in 1980 and 1981 (upto October) per month, capacity of Chasnala Burnpur Ropeway and present cost of transport per ton per Km. of coal by the thnee months of transport; facts in details;

(e) whether there $i_s \text{ scope of fur-ther enlarging the transport of cost by the ropeways; and$

(f) if so. steps taken on that?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE AND STEEL AND MINES (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) and (b). Month-wise production of coking coal at Chasnala and Jitpur mines of IISCO for the year 1980-81 and 1981-82 (April—October 1981) alongwith the per cent ash before and after washing is indicated in the statement (Annexure I). (c) Cost of production can not be disclosed in the commercial interest of the organisation.

(d) The entire production of Jitpur mines is transported to Chasnala washerv through a mono cable ropeway. Transportation of coal through ropeway to IISCO, Burnpur as well as by rail and road transport from Chasnala during the year 1980-81 and 1981-82 (April-October 1981) is given in the statement (Annexure-II). The present haulage capacity of the ropeway is 400 tonnes per hour on 2 shift basis. The present cost of transport per kilometre of coal by the three modes of transport is being ascertained and will be furnished later.

(e) an<u>d</u> (f) Main problem now affecting Chasnala-Burnpur aerial ropeway is the power interruptions in the system. Steps have been taken to have alternative source of power at the drive stations of the ropeway by installing diesel generating sets and it is expected that the same will be commissioned by the middle 'n٢ next year. There are some operational onl maintenance problems also which are being attended to.
