Central Team to Assess Loss in Cyclone Stormed Saurashtra Coast

1307. SHRI JANARDHANA
POOJARY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether cyclonic storm revaged the Saurashtra Coast for two days recently:
- (b) if so, whether any Central team has been sent to assess the loss due to storm;
- (c) if so, whether the team has submitted its report;
 - (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether State Government has approached the Centre for financial assistance in this regard; and
- (f) if so, details thereof and the reaction of Government thereon?

THE MINISTER \mathbf{OF} STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (SHRI R. V. SWAMINATHAN): (a) According to the India Meteorological Department, a severe cyclonic storm with core of hurricane winds crossed Saurashtra coasts near Mangrol around midnight of 1st November, 1981 and lay as cyclonic storm between Porbandar and Jamnagar on the morning of 2nd November, 1981. The districts affected are Junagadh, Rajkot, Jamnagar, Amreli, Bhavnagar, Surendranagar and Kuchchh, the worst being Junagadh.

(b) to (d). A detailed Memorandum and the quantum of Central assistance required for relief and rehabilitation of the people affected and for the repair and restoration of Public properties damaged, has not been received from the Government of

Gujarat. On receipt of the same, further necessary action of sending a Central Team will be considered.

(e) and (f) On the request of Government of Gujarat for an ad-hoc release of Rs. 5 crores, the Government of India sanctioned a ways and means advance of Rs. 5 crores. The State Government has also been sanctioned Rs. 8 crores (Rs. 5 crores for Kharif and Rs. 3 crores for Rabi) as short-term loan for purchase and distribution of agricultural inputs.

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI BHISHMA NARAIN SINGH): (a) and (b). These jhuggis exist on Railway land and the Ministry of Railway have intimated that, for removal of unauthorised jhuggis/jhompries on Railway land in Delhi area, they have sought assistance of Delhi Development Authority as decided in a meeting held by the Chief Secretary, Delhi Administration.

(c) It is proposed to provide resettlement facilities to the squatters left in residuary areas of Delhi in March, 1977.
