Travelling Allowance

Stipends

173. Shri E. C. Majhi: Will the Minister of Education and Scientific Research be pleased to state:

(a) the total number of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes holding Government of India stipends who appeared during 1956 and 1957 in F.A., F.Sc., B.A., and B.Sc. final examinations; and

(b) how many have come out successful?

The Minister of State in the Ministry of Education and Scientific Research (Dr. K. L. Shrimali): (a) & (b). The information asked for, may be available only with the educational Institutions (about 2,400 in number) imparting post-Matric education, where the Government of India Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes scholars, numbering more than 44,000 were studying in the years 1955-56 and 1956-57. The time and labour spent on collecting the required information from the various institutions will hardly be commensurate with the results to be achieved.

Colombo Plan

175. Shri Wodeyar: Will the Minister of Finance be pleased to state:

(a) the nature and the total quantity of aid given to India under the Colombo Plan during the year 1957; and

(b) the purposes for which the aid had been utilised?
