The Deputy Minister of Railways (Shri Shahnawas Khan): The total quota allotted to Central Railway for destinations on North Eastern Railway reached via Bhagalpur, Mokameh Ghat, Manduadih, Shahganj, Mathura and Varanasi, is 32-5 Broad Gauge wagons daily. Besides the above, booking of general goods traffic via Barabanki, Lucknow (Charbagh),

Kanpur, Bareily and Moradabad is free of quota limitation for somes served by each of these points.

The total quota allotted to all other Railways combined for destinations on North Eastern Railway reached via different transhipment points subject to quotas is 594 Broad Gauge wagons daily or 2,16,810 Broad Gauge wagons annually. No. of wagons allotted to Banda for the year 1957-58 are as under:—
