and Employees Union of NAFED. The Committee has also been authorised to take evidence and to seek clarifications from the Chairman and others, if necessary, and submit its report at the earliest. After the committee has examined the papers and collected facts, the matter will be considered by the Board of Directors for taking a decision.

- The question does not arise.
- (d) The Government are awaiting the decision of the Board in this regard.

Strike by Cane-growing Peasants of Bibar

6705. SHRI CHITTA BASU: Will the Minister of AGRICUL-TURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government aware of the fact that the Canegrowing peasants of Bihar went on a strike with effect from 21 December, 1981 demanding the fixing of caneprice at Rs. 35 per quintal and immediate payment of about Rs. one crore as arrears due to the cane growers : and
- (b) if so, the reaction of Government thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF AGRICUL-TURE AND RURAL DEVELOP-MENT (KUMARI KAMLA KUMARI): (a) and (b). A Statement is attached.

Statement

According to a report received from the Government of Bihar, the cane growers started an agitation, on 21-12-1981, demanding a price of Rs. 35.00 per quintal for their cane and the payment of cane price arrears. The State Government, in consultation with cane growers and sugar mills' representatives, fixed the cane price at Rs. 20.50 per quintal against the statutory minimum price of Rs. 13.00 per quintal linked to 8.5%.

Since the cane price had been fixed by the State Government after taking into account all the factors governing sugarcane cultivation and the sugar industry existing at that time, they did not consider it necessary to increase the price beyond Rs. 20.50 per quintal.

The total cane price arrears, as on 28-2-1982, were Rs. 81.02 lakhs out of which Rs. 13.03 lakhs were outstanding against the private sugar mills, Rs. 15.04 lakhs against the units of the Bihar State Sugar Corporation and the remaining amount of Rs. 52.95 lakhs was the pre-take over liability outstanding against the Motipur Sugar Factory which has been taken over under the Industries (Development and Regulation) Act, 1951. The State Government are making efforts to have the cane price arrears cleared at the earliest.
