## Rural Electrification in Punjab

In November, 1957, however, the Planning Commission asked the Punjab Government for details of sub-transmission, distribution bulk supply under Bhakra Nangal Estimates Part II, which would also include rural electrification. The details asked for by the Planning Commission have not yet been from the Punjab Government.
