World's Wettest Spot

1337. Sardar Iqbal Singh: Will the Minister of Transport and Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the World's wettest spot has changed from Cherrapunji to Mawsyhram, a tiny village in the Khasi Hills.
- (b) if so, the correct position in this regard; and
- (c) total rainfall at these two places during the last ten years?

The Deputy Minister of Civil Aviation (Shri Mohiuddin): (a) and (b) Complete year's data, i.e. rainfall data for all the twelve months of a year, are available only for four years from 1912—17 and for five years for the later period from 1940 These records show that during these years Mawsyhram had an average of about

35 inches more rain in the year than Cherrapunji. Nevertheless, during the year 1952 for which complete year's data is available. Cherrapunji had about 3 inches more rain than Mawsyhram It cannot, therefore, be stated categorically that the world's wettest spot has changed from Cherrapunji to Mawsyhram. The point to bear in mind in this connexion is that these two places are only twelve miles apart
