Tes Trade

1738. Shri Daijit Singh: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether the export trade of tea has made any progress after the setting up of the Tea Board; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri): (a) and (b). The Tea Board was set up on the 1st April, 1954. Since then, exports were:---

1954-55	459.6 m	lbs.
1955-56	405.1 m	lbs.
1956-57	513.9 m	lbs.
1957-58	422.7 m	lbs.

These fluctuations are the result of several factors like the international situation and the position of supply and demand in the world market over which the Board has no control. Sustained effort is however made by the Board to maintain exports of tea.

Indian Sufferers of Great War in Burma

1739. Sardar Iqbal Singh: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to refer to the reply given to Starred Question No. 10 on the 11th November, 1957 and state the progress since made in securing payment of compensation to the Indians who had to suffer losses in Burma during the last Great War?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): There has been no progress in this matter since then.

Automatic Looms for Punjab

1749. Sandar Iqbal Singh: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) the number of automatic looms allotted to Punjab State so far; and

(b) whether these looms were allotted to the spinning mills alone or to the textile mills with weaving plants? The Minister of Commerce and Badustry (Shri Lai Bahader Shambil): (a) Licences under the Industries (Development and Regulation) Act, 1951 were issued for the installation of 462 automatic looms in the State of Punjab.

(b) These looms were allotted to two composite units.

Afghan Nationals in Bombay

(a) the number of Afghan nationals in Marathawada region of Bombay State;

(b) how many of them have not renewed their passports;

(c) how many of them have purchased land and house property in contravention of rules;

(e) what action Government propose to take in such cases?

The Prime Minister and Minister of External Affairs (Shri Jawaharlai Nehru): We have called for the information from the Government of Bombay. It will be placed on the Table as soon as it is available.

(b) whether there was any export of these vegetable oils;

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Lai Bahadur Shastri): (a) Production of edible vagetable edis viz., groundnut oil, mustard edi, peramum oil, cottonseed oil, coconut oil, kardiseed oil, nigerseed oil in 1957-58 was 15-5 lakh tons.

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) 9,200 tons valued at Rs. 145 lakhs.

(d) Aden, Australia, West Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, U.K. and Netherlands.
