## Training in Handicrafts

Written Answers

61. Shri Valpayee: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

- (a) whether schemes for training in handicrafts have been submitted by the State Governments.
- (b) if so, the names of the States and the main features of the schemes submitted by them,
- (c) whether any of the schemes have been approved by the Central Government, and
- (d) the amount, if any, sanctioned by the Central Government to these States?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Lai Bahadur Shastri):

(a) to (d) In 1958-59, 58 schemes for training in handicrafts, including training-cum-production, have been submitted by the State Governments of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Bombay, Madhya Pradesh, Madras, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal Government have approved these schemes and a total grant of Rs 7.52,306 has been sanctioned to the State Governments for the implementation of 41 schemes The amount of financial assistance to be given in respect of the remaining 17 schemes is still under consideration

The main features of the schemes submitted by the State Governments are imparting of training in improved methods and better techniques of production and in production of handicrafts articles, which are in need of intensive development

There is a provision in almost all the schemes of awarding supends ranging from Rs. 25 to Rs. 30 per month to each trainee. On completion of training, the trainees are encouraged to form co-operative societies with financial assistance as prescribed by Government from time to time

## Refined Oil

The Minister of Commerce and Industry (Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri): (a) Refined oil can be edible or nonedible, depending on what oils are refined

(b) During 1957, the export of four major refined edible oils, viz, linseed, cottonseed, coconut and mustard was 467.718 cwts valued at about Rs 3 crores
