(b) TV services through INSAT at Nagpur is expected to commence from the 15th August, 1982. The site for the Programme Production Centre to be set up at Nagpur has been selected on 31-1-1982.

Coalfields Reconstruction Scheme

- 253. SHRI HARIHAR SOREN: Will the Minister of ENERGY be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government have introduced Coalfields Reconstruction Scheme:
- (b) if so, the names of the coalfields which have been identified for reconstruction;
- (c) the estimated cost of each of the coal field reconstruction programmes;
- (d) the expected time of the implementation of the reconstruction programme; and
 - (c) the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF COAL IN THE MINISTRY OF ENERGY GARGI SHANKAR (SHRI MISHRA): (a) Government have decided to formulate Coalfield-wise master plans with a view to reconstruct/reorganise the mining activity in the area for achieving plan objectives.

- (b) Master plan has already been prepared in respect of Jharia coalfield. For other coalfields like North Karanpura, Talcher, etc. master plans are yet to be prepared.
- (c) The cost of Jharia coalfield reorganisation programme has been estimated at Rs. 5372 crores.
- (d) and (e). The implementation of Jharia coalfield reorganisation programme is expected to be completed by 2000 A. D. and envisages construction of 9 large opencast mines and 21 under-ground mines.
