Rise in Consumer Price Index

5426. **SHRIMATI PRAMILA DANDAVATE:**

SHRIMATI KISHORI SINHA:

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the consumer price index has risen by 9 per cent during the past month; and

(b) if not, what are the actual figures of consumer price index for four successive weeks in July, 1982?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) and (b). The All-India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers (1960-100) is compiled on monthly basis and the latest available Index for June, 1982 at 470 shows an increase of 1.7 Per cent over the level of 462 for the previous month.

Classification of Airports

5427. **SHRI A. NEELALOHITHA-DASAN NADAR:** Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) how many airports India is having at present;

(b) their details with regard to classification of each; and

(c) whether there is any scheme for the development of these airports; if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) and (b). There are 440

aerodromes in India. This includes 4 International Airports under the control of International Airports Authority of India, 87 domestic airports under the Civil Aviation Department, 157 with Defence authorities, 136 with State Governments and 56 with private parties.

(c) The Sixth Five Year Plan envisages an expenditure of Rs. 147 crores in respect of construction of new aerodromes, and strengthening/extension of runways, taxiways and aprons, extension/modification/construction of terminal buildings, improvement/provision of safety service equipment at the existing domestic aerodromes to which Indian Airlines/Vayudoot are operating/propose to operate air services. The plans also include augmentation/modernisation of radio, radar, navigation aids and communication facilities at domestic and international airports.

Plans have also been drawn for expansion of the international airports at a total cost of Rs. 141 crores during the Sixth Plan period. The development plans include construction of Terminal Complex II (Phase II) at Bombay airport; construction of interim international departure terminal and new international terminal complex at Delhi airport; construction of new domestic terminal at Madras airport; extension of air side of the international arrival hall and enlargement and strengthening of apron areas for parking over 20 aircraft at Calcutta airport; provision of category II lighting system at Bombay and Delhi airports; and construction of new fire station at Madras and Calcutta airports.

Functions of Banking Service Recruitment Board

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JANARDHANA POOJARY): (a) and (b). 9 Banking Service Recruitment Boards (B.S.R.Bs.) have been set up to

make direct recruitment to the officers' cadre of the participating banks on all India basis and to the clerical cadre of all the nationalised banks within their geographical area of jurisdiction. The recruitment is made on the basis of open competition. A Statement indicating the location of these Boards, names of the participating banks and geographical area assigned to the Boards is attached. These Boards do not have any branches.
