- (d) the extent of loss and damake and
- (e) the other details relating the incident?

The Deputy Minister of Reliways (Shri Shahnawas Khan): (a) Yes

- (b) Yes Three parcel vans No 93 Dn Renigunta-Raichur mixed train were looted by the miscreants
- (c) Yes The crowd set fire to a stack of sleepers
- (d) The cost of parcels containing fruits and one case of fountain pens looted is valued at Rs. 1000. The estimated cost of railway property damaged in Rs 10,000
- (e) On 18th August, 1959, a mob came to the Railway Station Cuddapah and demanded closing down of refreshment room, stall and goods shed. A section of the crowd moved towards Bukhta bridge and squatted on the track preventing thereby movement of all trains between Cuddapah and Krishnapuram The mob also

cut telegraph, telephone and signal wires paralysing all communication. At about 5 P.M. the same day the mob again gathered at Cuddapah station and started looting some parcel vans of Renigunta-Raichur passenger. They also pelted stones on the police party when recourse was taken to tear smoke. The mob then shifted to Rayanchoti level crossing and started damaging the track when the police had to open fire and the mob finally dispersed after the firing and the situation was brought under control
