- (b) (i) To order for screening of all casual labour for absorption in Railway service, (ii) to fix Rs. 200-250 rates to labour engaged in permanent way, (iii) to publish seniority list of casual labour and (iv) to grant temporary status to all casual labour.
- (c) Casual labour have been screened for absorption in accordance with the availability of vacancies. The casual labour are paid wages based on minimum of the scale of Rs. 195-232 and are not entitled to the scale rate of Rs. 200-250. Seniority list was displayed as required under the Rules. Project casual labour are not entitled to temporary status.
