

Supply of drinking water to the problem villages

1695. PROF. NARAIN CHAND PARASHAR: Will the Minister of WORKS AND HOUSING be pleased to state:

(a) the percentage of problem villages, State-wise which have been given the supply of safe drinking water by the end of the financial year 1981-82 and the target date when 100 per cent coverage of all such villages by the supply of safe drinking water would be ensured in each State;

(b) the actual number of villages and population (i) benefited and (ii) still to be benefited by the D.W.S.S. programmes;

(c) whether any liberal allocations have been made in Sixth Five Year Plan for this purpose; and

(d) if so, the nature and details thereof, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS AND WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI BHISHMA NARA-IN SINGH: (a) and (b). Statement

I, indicating the State-wise number of problem villages and their popula-tion according to the 1971 census, which have been supplied drinking water during the first two years of the 6th Plan i.e. by the end of the finan-cial year 1981-82; the percentage of problem villages provided with drinking water supply during the same period and the number of prob-lem villages and their population according to the 1971 census yet to be covered is enclosed. The effort will be to cover all the identified problem villages with at least one source of safe potabe water during the 6th Plan i.e. by March 1985.

(c) The outlay for this purpose in the 6th Plan is Rs. 2007.11 crores, which is considerably higher than the outlay of Rs. 429.27 crores in the 5th Plan (1974-79).

(d) The State-wise break up of the outlay under the Centrally Sponsored Accelerated Rural Water Supply Programme is given in Statement No. II. State-wise break up under the Minimum Needs Programme (State Sector) for rural water supply is given in Statement No. III.
