Bye pass at Trivandrum for National Highway No. 47

3169. PROF. P. J. KURIEN : Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is a proposal to construct a bye-pass at Trivandrum for National Highway No. 47;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether it is a fact that the proposal is long pending clearance;

(d) if so,, the reasons therefor; and

(e) whether Government propose to take steps for immediate sanction of the proposal?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI SITA RAM KESARI): and (b). Yes, Sir. For a part length of 20.5 Kms. between Kazhkkuttam and Vezhamuttam near Kovalam on National Highway 47.

(c) to (e). No, Sir. Land acquisition estimate for the 20.5 Kms. length of the bypass the alignment of which has been finalised, was sanctioned under Job No. 319-KR-47 in January 1978 for Rs. 205.07 lakhs. The acquisition of land

is still in progress. Further sanctions can only be given after the land has been acquired subject to availability of resources and overall priorities on an all-India basis.

Lifting Samples of Spurious Drugs from the Market and Adequate Analytical Facilities

3170. SHRI SOMNATH CHATTERJEE: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether lifting samples of spurious and sub-standard drugs from retail shops at regular intervals and setting up adequate analytical facilities to analyse the sample quickly before the produce is sold out can be tried at an effective measures against this practice; and

(b) if so, whether the Government are going to try the measures soon, if so, details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI KUMUD BEN M. JOSHI): (a) The question is not quite clear. However, under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act and Rules made there-

under, the Drugs Inspector are expected to draw samples of drugs not only from the retail chemist shop but also from the premises wherein any drug is being manufactured. As such, sufficient safeguards already exist under the Act to ensure the quality of drug before the produce is sold out.

(b) Does not arise.

Recommendation of Sane Committee

3171. SHRIMATI SUSEELA GOPALAN: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the V. C. Sane Committee recommended for weeding out of irrational and harmful drug formulations;

(b) if so, whether the Government have accepted it;

(c) if so, details thereof;

(d) what are the other recommendations made by the Sane Committee; and

(e) how many recommendations have been accepted by the Government and details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI KUMUD-BEN M. JOSHI): (a) Yes.

(b) to (e) The Sane Committee examined 32 categories of fixed dose combinations and recommended weeding out fully and/or partially 20 categories of those combinations. That Committee also recommended reviewing of all combinations containing tranquilisers, especially Diazepam.

The Recommendations of the Sane Committee were examined by the Drugs Consultative Committee who ultimately recommended weeding out fully or partially of 23 categories of fixed dose combinations. The Government in consultation with the Drugs

Technical Advisory Board have finally decided to weed out fully or partially 18 categories of fixed dose combinations as per the list given in the statement attached.

Statement

CATEGORIES OF FIXED DOSE COMBINATIONS RECOMMENDED TO BE WEEDED OUT BY THE DRUGS TECHNICAL ADVISORY BOARD.

1. Fixed dose combinations of Amidopyrine.

2. Fixed dose combinations of Vitamins with anti-inflammatory agents and tranquilisers.

3. Fixed dose combinations of Atropine in Analgesics and Antipyretics.

4. Fixed dose combinations of Strychnine & Caffeine in tonics.

5. Fixed dose combinations of Yohimbine and Strychnine with testosternal and Vitamins.

6. Fixed dose combinations of Iron with Strychnine Arsenic & Yohimbine.

7. Fixed dose combinations of Sodium Bronide/Chloral hydrate with other drugs.

8. Fixed dose combinations of Ayurvedic, Unani Drugs with modern drugs.

9. Fixed dose combinations of phenace tin.

10. Fixed dose combinations of Anti-histaminics with Anti-diarhoeals.

11. Fixed dose combinations of Penicillin with Sulphonamides.

12. Fixed dose combinations of Vitamins with Analgesics.

13. Fixed dose combinations of Tetracycline with Vitamin C.

14. Fixed dose combinations of Hydroxyquinoline group of drugs except preparations which are used
