Public Schools

1983. Pandit J. P. Jyotishi: Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

(a) the number of public schools in the country;

(b) the number of boys studying in each of them;

(c) the number of merit scholarships given to boys studying there;

(d) the percentage of amount spent for boys in these institutions; and

(e) how does the expenditure per head compare with the expenditure in schools of the same standard in other categories?

The Minister of Education (Dr. K. L. Shrimall): (a) 20 (This includes all public schools which are members of the Indian Public Schools Conference).

(b) Information is not available.

(c) 329 (274 boys and 55 girls).

(d) and (e). This information is not available. The Government of India are not paying any grants-in-aid to these schools from 1958-59.

Stoppage of Construction work in Manipur

(a) whether it is a fact that construction of Government buildings in Manipur was suspended in the 1st week of March 1960 due to non-availability of cement and steel; and

(b) if so, the reasons therefor?
