Sarda Sahayak Irrigation Project (U.P.)

2356. SHRI H.N. NANJE GOW-DA: Will the Minister of IRRIGA-TION be pleased to state:

- (a) how much amount had been sanctioned for the Sarda-Sahayak Pariyojna of Uttar Pradesh;
- (b) whether it is a fact that the estimated cost is insufficient and it may go up; and
- (c) if so, the total amount likely to be spent and by what time the Sarda-Sahayak Pariyojna will be complet-

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z.R. ANSARI): (a) to (c). The approved estimated cost of Sarda-Sahayak Project (1976) was Rs. 199.87 crores. However, it has now been reported by the State Government that the latest estimated cost is Rs. 378 crores. An expenditure of Rs. 303.52 crores was incurred by the end of March, 1980. Against a spillover cost of Rs. 74.48 crores, the outay proposed during the Sixth Plan by the State Government is only Rs. 43.35 crores. The actual expenditure incurred during the Sixth Plan is as under:

> 1980-81 25.46 crores 1981-82 18.20 crores 1982-83 25.00 crores (outlay)

Although bulk of the irrigation potential under this project has been created, the project will be completed in all respects only in the Seventh Plan period.
