District Construction of Silchar Sports Association Stadium Silchar

2401. SHRI SONTOSH MOHAN DEV: Will the Minister of SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether he is aware that Silchar District Sports Association Stadium at Silchar in Assam is in incomplete stage ;
- (b) the quantum of money allotted from State and Central Budget for the said Stadium;
- (c) the quantum of money raised by the Districts Sports Association Silchar, and
- (d) the steps Government propose to take to complete this Stadium?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SUPPLY AND OF THE DEPARTMENT OF SPORTS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) the District Sports Association, Silchar sent a communication in April, 1981 according to which the stadium was yet incomplete. No further communication has been received by the Department of Sports in this regard.

(b) and (c). The maximum grant of Rs. 50,000 from the Central Government then admissible under the Central Scheme of financial assistance to State Sports Council etc. was sanctioned in respect of the above stadium and its release was completed in February, 1978. A matching amount of Rs. 50,000 was also sanctioned by the State Government of Assam. As already mentioned, no further communication after April, 1981 has been received in respect of the Stadium in question and the information, therefore, of the contribution made for its construction by the District Sports Association, Silchar is not available.

(d) The balance amount needed for the completion of the stadium is to be raised by the District Sports Association, Silchar according to their original application.

Relief Measures at Deoli Village

- 2402. DR. A.U. AZMI : Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that about 100 Harijans families of Deoli Village in Orissa had nothing to eat for three days as their village was submerged with flood waters and no relief measures reached them and they had to leave their village because the upper-cast people snatched away the entire relief stocks;
 - (b) if so, reasons thereof; and
- (c) action taken to check the non-occurrence of such events in future?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF AGRICUL-TURE AND RURAL DEVELOP-(KUMARI KAMLA MENT KUMARI): (a) No, Sir. According to the State Government the Village of Deoli of Kakatpur Tahasil of Puri District has only seven households with a population of 35, and of these, six families belong to Scheduled Caste/Harijans. State Government have reported that flood waters reached this village on 31-8-82 and relief was distributed to affected persons in the afternoon of that day.

(b) and (c). Do not arise.

ICAR Poultry Project and Expenditure

- 2403. DR. A.U. AZMI: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) the total expenditure, expenditure on feed and actual revenue

receipt accrued for each research centre of ICAR Poultry Project yearwise for Fifth and Sixth Plan period;

- (b) number of adult birds kept per year in Fifth and Sixth Plan centre-wise, with corresponding number of eggs and/or weight of meat produced and the price of
- (c) whether Government propose to stop imports of commercial poultry breeding stocks; and
- (d) whether Government satisfied with the performance of each centre under ICAR Poultry Research Project and how much expenditure on works has been made at each centre from start and how much additional amount proposed?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF AGRICUL-TURE AND RURAL DEVELOP-MENT (SHRI R. V. SWAMINA-THAN): (a) Total expenditure and revenue receipts unit-wise and yearwise for fifth and sixth plan period

are given in Statement-I and II respectively.

Information on expenditure on feed alone is being collected and shall be placed on the Lok Sabha in due course.

- (b) Information is being collected and shall be placed on the table of Lok Sabha in due course.
- (c) The policy with respect to import of commercial poultry stocks is finalised by the Commerce Ministry after considering the recommendations of Agriculture Ministry every Year. The import of poultry stock during 1983-84 will, therefore, depend on the decision of the Government to be taken in due course.
- (d) A review committee constituted by ICAR has reviewed the functioning of each unit and has found it satisfactory and has recommended the continuance of all the centres during the sixth plan. Information in regard to expenditure on works is being collected and shall be placed on the table of the Lok Sabha in due course of time.
