(b) and (c). A statement containing the required information is laid on the Table. [See Appendix III, anmexure No. 8].

Educated Unemployed

- 2149. Shri Madhusudan Rao: Will the Minister of Labour and Employment be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the number of educated unemployed has increased in Andhra Pradesh during 1959-60 as compared to 1958-59; and
- (b) what has been the effect of the scheme undertaken by Government to reduce unemployment amongst educated persons?
- The Deputy Minister of Labour (Shri Abid Ali): (a) Yes. The number of educated applicants on the Live Registers of Employment Exchanges increased from 30,290 at the end of December, 1958 to 32,429 at the end of December, 1958.
- (b) Various Plan Schemes are creating additional employment opportunities for the educated also.

Publications Division

2150. Shri Madhusudan Rao: Will the Minister of Information and Broadcasting be pleased to state the net profits earned by the Publications. Division up to 31st December, 1959.

The Minister of Information and Broadcasting (Dr. Keskar): It is not possible to give the net profits earned by the Publications Division as it is not maintained as a Commercial Department and no profit and loss accounts are kept. The total revenue from sale of books etc. this year (upto 21st March, 1960) was Rs. 22.04.358.

Sterling for Purchase of Paper

- 2152. Shri V. P. Nayar: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Government of India have allocated any sterling for the purchase of paper;
- (b) if so the amount and date of allocation;
- (c) whether the allocation has not yet been utilised by State Trading Corporation; and
 - (d) if so, the reasons therefor?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): (a) No, Sir.

State Trading Corporation

2153: Shri V. P. Nayar: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state what was the total amount of demurrage paid by the State Trading Corporation in 1958-59, port-wise, for imports and the reasons therefor?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Kanungo): No demurrage has been paid by the State Trading Corporation on imports during the year 1958-59.

Labour Welfare in U.P.

- (a) the amount of money which has been allotted to Uttar Pradesh for
