9494. SHRI T. S. NEGI: Will the AGRICULTURE Minister of pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that some of the non-official Chairmen are holding posts of public sector Boards beyond 60 years of age and in some cases continuously for over 15 years as for example Dairy Board; and
- (b) whether Government are aware that a 62 year old person has been appointed as Chairmen of ASRB last month burriedly against Government's policy?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICUL-TURE (RAO BIRENDRA SINGH): (a) Chairman of the National Dairy Development Board/Indian Dairy Corporation has been holding the post in an honorary capacity since the inception of the organisations in 1965 and 1970 respectively. The Chairman is a professional and expert in the field of Dairy Science and on account of his association in this field for quite a large number of years he has acquired extensive knowledge and expertise in the field. The Govt. have therefore, found him suitable for holding the post of Chairmen, N. D. D. B/I.D.C.

(b) The post of Chairman, Agricultural Scientists Recruitment Board is one of the top Research Management Scientific positions of the Council and is invariably filled up on the basis of merit from amongst scientists of great eminence and distinction in the field of agricultural research and education who have held positions of top responsibility such as Vice-Chancellors of Agricultural Universities, Deputy Directors

General of I.C.A.R., Directors of ICAR institutes etc. According to the recruitlment rules of the post, it is a tenure post and appointment thereto can be made for a period of six years or till the incumbent attains the age of 65 years, whichever is earlier. Since the retirement age for this assignment is 65 years, superannuated persons having the requisite qualifications and experience and who are men of eminence can be appointed to the post of Chairman, ASRB. This appointment has been made recently accordingly with approval of the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet of which the Prime Minister herself is the Chairman.
