Production of Shrimps

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government have taken up any scheme for increasing cultivation of shrimps in inland fisheries;

(b) if so, details of the scheme, State-wise expenditure and target; and

(c) what other steps, if any, have Government taken to increase production of shrimps or any other fish ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN
THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE
(SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA) :

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) During the Vth Five Year Plan, under the Centrally Sponsored sector a scheme for Development of Brackish-water Fish Farming with area

development concept has been taken up for implementation. The scheme envisages development of 1500 hectares of brackishwater area into farm ponds for culture of shrimps and fish in 8 maritime States and 3 inland States having ground saline water potential. The scheme with a total outlay of Rs. 9.96 crores is expected to benefit about 1,000 fish farmer families, by providing them the required financial and extension support. For making available quality prawn seed to the farmers, provision has been made for setting up commercial prawn seed farms/hatcheries.

During 1982-83, the first year of the scheme, Central share of funds amounting to Rs. 43 lakhs, has been made available to the participating States (West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu at the rate of Rs. 7 lakhs each; Maharashtra and Gujarat at the rate of Rs. 5 lakhs each; and Orissa, Kerala, Karnataka, Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan at the rate of Rs. 2 lakhs each).

Upto 1984-85 the eight coastal States are expected to develop 175 hectares each and the three inland States a total of 100 hectares of brackish-water area.

(c) A scheme for the establishment of pilot project on Brackishwater Aquaculture was taken up in all the Maritime States of the country with a total outlay of Rs. 1.21 crores during the Fifth Plan. Under this scheme States were given 100 per cent grant for the construction of a Brackishwater Fish Farms of about 50 hectares each to demonstrate the feasibility for farming prawn and other salt water fishes.

Fish Farmers' Development Agencies have been set up in selected districts under Centrally Sponsored Schemes for increasing the production of freshwater fish.

Deep sea fishing vessels are also being added to increase marine catches.
